There is a direct relationship between the practical work of the adult and self-discipline in the child. Look to self-discipline of the adult before considering the question of discipline in the young child. The more meaningful and necessary work the adult engages in, the more the child's own will develops both in terms of capacities for engaging his or her will and actual skill development. Since imitation is the mode of learning in the young child, a central role of the adult is to become worthy of that imitation.
